


Definitely DOMINGUITA: ALL FOR ONE

Wielding chocolate-covered toilet plungers, the crew sets out to avoid fantastical fiascos and cataclysmic calamities mirroring the adventures of Dumas's *The Three Musketeers*.

All for One - Pretending

Dominguita, Pancho and Steph all love to dress up and act like characters in books which were written long ago—books like Don Quijote, Treasure Island, The Three Musketeers, and Sherlock Holmes. Dom often finds parts of their costumes at el Señor Fuentes's junk shop and other parts they each find at home.

Think about a book that you love from a different time or from a different place. Hunt around your house (with your parent's permission of course) and find things to help you dress up like that character. Do like Dominguita does, use unusual things to make your costumes—like a bucket for a helmet or a dandelion weeder for a pirate weapon.

Write a paragraph about what you used to make your costume and why you thought that was the right thing to do. If it's a book you really know well, write some adventures that you could have if you were a character in that book, like Dom and Pancho and Steph.



All for One - Thinking About It

Thinking about what you read in All for One, answer the following questions on a separate sheet of paper:

1. Dom talks about upholding her musketeer honor when Rafi and el Señor Fuentes think she didn't do what she said she would. Why was that important to Dom? Is it important to you that people believe what you say and are true to your word? Was it important that Dom clear her name even though the pigs were already gone? What would you have done if the same thing happened to you? Use another page if you need to.

2. Have you ever gotten so flustered that you've forgotten something very important, like Dom did? Can you let us know what happened? How could you help yourself so you can remember things when you're flustered.

3. Pancho wants to video what happens when they go to Tava's Butcher. Steph wants Dom to find the real copy of the receipt that Vinnie Bublasi wrote. Why is that important?

4. What finally convinced Mr. Tava that Dom had paid for the pigs on time?

5. Why was Mr. Tava upset the the musketeers got close to the meat cutting area?

6. Dom, Pancho and Steph were not happy that Mr. Desmond got the pigs, even though they should have belonged to el Señor Fuentes. Dom, Pancho, and Steph accepted their disappointment, but then took action. What did they do to protect the rest of the party. Was it a good idea to try to protect the rest of the party instead of just being mad?

7. Dom and Pancho tell Steph that having suckling pig at a quinceañera party is a Cuban tradition. It's something that Cuban families do during big parties and holidays. What traditions does your family have?

8. Abuela didn't have a quinceañera party. Her sister Yuyú did, but she had to leave a precious necklace behind. Think about all the things that immigrants have to leave behind when they come to a new country. Immigrants have to leave more than things behind. Let your reader know how you would feel if you had to come to a new country..

9. When Dom, Pancho and Steph loaded the ice cream cart with the appetizers for Leni's party as well as real ice cream, AND they gave away ice cream to the bullies, they didn't ask anyone if they could do that. Why do you think they felt comfortable taking and giving away that ice cream?

10. Dom, Pancho and Steph talk in code many times using words that remind them of the books they are mimicking. What kind of words did they use on pages 97 and 109 when they were talking about what they needed to do to stop Leni's earrings from being stolen, or how to protect the community center from the bullies.

11. Pancho and Dom are big readers. When they tried to trick the Bublassis, they sent the meanies to a pretend address—221B Baker Street. That is a famous address in London. Find out what famous book that address is from.

12. One tool the musketeers used to gross out Vinnie Bublasi was to eat a piece of chocolate from the toilet plunger. It worked! Is that something you would do? Tell your reader why or why not.

DID YOU NOTICE FUN GROUPS OF WORDS WHICH HAVE THE SAME SOUND IN ALL FOR ONE? WE CALL THAT ALLITERATION.

ALLITERATION IS REPEATING THE SAME SAME LETTERS OR SOUNDS IN WORDS THAT ARE NEXT TO OR CLOSE TO EACH OTHER.

HERE IS A WORD BANK. USE THESE WORDS IN PHRASES THAT MAKE SENSE. FOR EXAMPLE: FLUFFY FEATHERS FLYING, OR FLUFFY FEATHERS WERE FLYING.

YOU DON'T HAVE TO USE ALL THE WORDS, BUT YOU MAY USE AS MANY WORDS AS YOU LIKE SO LONG AS THEY MAKE SENSE. WHEN YOU HAVE FOUND ALL THE GREAT PHRASES WITH ALLITERATION, THINK OF YOUR OWN EXAMPLES TO ADD TO THE LIST. WORK ON A SEPARATE PAGE.

All for One - Metaphors

A METAPHOR IS A COMPARISON OF ONE THING OR SITUATION, TO EXPLAIN ANOTHER. IN ALL FOR ONE, FOOD IS A METAPHOR FOR FRIENDSHIP.

WHEN THE MUSKETEERS ARE TALKING ABOUT MALANGA FRITTERS, THEY ARE EXPLORING THE IDEA OF HOW WE MAY THINK WE WILL NOT LIKE A FOOD THE FIRST TIME WE SEE IT. WE MAY THINK WE WILL NOT LIKE A FOOD BECAUSE IT LOOKS DIFFERENT, BECAUSE WE'VE NEVER SEEN IT BEFORE, OR JUST BECAUSE IT'S NEW. BUT ONCE WE GIVE THAT FOOD A CHANCE, WE MAY LIKE IT, LIKE STEPH ENDS UP LIKING MALANGA FRITTERS.

THE METAPHOR COMPARES LIKING SOME FOODS TO MAKING FRIENDS. WE MAY THINK THAT SOMEONE MAY NOT MAKE A GOOD FRIEND BECAUSE HE OR SHE LOOKS DIFFERENT, BECAUSE WE HAVE NEVER SEEN HER OR HIM BEFORE, OR JUST BECAUSE HE OR SHE ARE NEW. IF WE GIVE THAT NEW PERSON A CHANCE, THAT NEW PERSON MAY BECOME OUR BEST FRIEND.

THINK OF A FOOD THAT YOU THOUGHT YOU WOULDN'T LIKE, AND THEN ONCE YOU TRIED IT, YOU ACTUALLY LIKED IT. TELL YOUR READER ABOUT IT.

THINK OF MEETING A PERSON FOR THE FIRST TIME—IS THERE A PERSON WHO YOU MAY HAVE MET AND THEN YOU BECAME FRIENDS EVEN THOUGH YOU WERE DIFFERENT AND YOU DIDN'T THINK YOU'D LIKE THEM AT FIRST?

IF NOT, THINK OF WAYS TO MAKE FRIENDS WITH A PERSON WHO IS DIFFERENT FROM YOU. THINK OF WHAT SORT OF QUESTIONS YOU CAN ASK SO YOU CAN FIND THINGS THAT YOU HAVE IN COMMON. THINK OF HOW THAT PERSON WHO IS NEW WILL FEEL COMING TO YOUR SCHOOL OR NEIGHBORHOOD. THINK OF WHAT YOU CAN DO TO MAKE THAT PERSON FEEL WELCOME.

All for One - Figurative Language

FIGURATIVE LANGUAGE IS LANGUAGE WRITERS USE TO MAKE A DESCRIPTION BETTER. THERE ARE MANY INSTANCES OF FIGURATIVE LANGUAGE IN *ALL FOR ONE*. FIGURATIVE LANGUAGE GIVES THE READER A BETTER IDEA OF WHAT SOMETHING LOOKS LIKE, FEELS LIKE, TASTES LIKE, SOUNDS LIKE.

HERE ARE SOME EXAMPLES:

DOMINGUITA AND HER CREW SOLVE PROBLEMS IN SOME OF THE BOOKS. THEY HAVE A SPECIAL METHOD THAT DOM AND PANCHO LEARNED FROM THEIR MATH TEACHER. THEY DIVIDE A PAPER INTO COLUMNS.

IN ONE COLUMN THEY LIST THE ANSWER THEY WANT TO FIND OUT. IN ANOTHER COLUMN THEY LIST WHAT THEY KNOW AND IN THE THIRD COLUMN THEY LIST WHAT THEY NEED TO FIGURE OUT BEFORE THEY FIND THE FINAL ANSWER. 
RESCUING THE QUEEN'S DIAMONDS
